## Waiting best solution for Summer Olympics

On February 12, the International Olympic Committee met to discuss President Carter's proposed boycott, transferring, or moving of the Moscow Olympics.

Later, after the meeting was over, Lord Killanin, president of the ICC, announced that the Moscow Olympics would be held as planned,

without moving or delaying them. Lord Killanin also stated that all 73 members attending the ICC general session voted in favor of keeping the Summer Olympics in Moscow. He mentioned that the national Olympic committee has the power to decide to send teams to the Olympics,not the governments, and also the nations have until May 24 to decide if they will send a team to the Olympics.

U.S. State Department officals have stated that they now have about 30 nations is support of the boycott and that they would support alternate games to be held for the nations who do not participate in the Moscow Olympics.

President Carter has called for a boycott of the Olympics, but one of the best solutions is to wait until the May 24 dealine to decide whether or not to sent a team to the Olympics. By this time, it should be clear on whether or not the Russians intend to pull out of Afghanistan or not.

Jarvis! Again:

Well, here we go again. Our old friend Howard Javis is back and looking out for the California taxpayers once more.

His new tax initiative, called Jarvis II, which would cut personal income taxes in half, could drastically cut school programs, according to predictions by many experts.

For example, legisaltive analyst William Hamm has projected that a \$2.8 billion dollar reduction in state aid would be dealt on public schools statewide meaning a 40% loss in expenditure per child statewide.

CTA advocate Jim Donnelly had translated that loss into \$660 per student or nearly \$17 thousand per classroom, assuming and average class size of 26 students.

Remember Jarvis I two years ago? A lot was said about how much would be lost in or school if Prop., 13 were passed.

It did, and "survived" but only because we had \$5 billion in state funds as bailout money, and things like utilities prices raised. If Jarvis II passes, chances are this time we will not survive since our state budget is now operating in the red. With Jarvis I, we at Eisenhower lost most of our bus transportation, our sophomore sports program and our janitorial services. What will go after Jarvis II? Junior varsity sports, perhaps? The rest of the buses? All the custodians?

No matter what the cutback possibilities are, don't expect our California taxpayers to give it much thought. They showed us last time they're much more interested in cutting personal taxes than they are in supporting our schools.
