MAINTENANCE SUPPORT SPECIALIST I

DEFINITION

Under the direction of the Maintenance Supervisor, monitors the District's Energy Management and Security Systems, including video and incident alarms; performs skilled work reporting all incident and system trouble alarms to the appropriate designated supervisor; and performs other related work as assigned and/or required.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES

- monitors the District's Energy Management, video and incident alarm systems
- reports on incidents such as vandalism, graffiti, and any related building damage
- contacts supervisors, duty officers, or any appropriate emergency agencies regarding incidents
- generates search reports and documents daily incidents such as graffiti and damage to buildings
- submits maintenance work orders as required to repair all defective and/or malfunctioning equipment on the Energy Management, video and incident alarm systems

QUALIFICATIONS

<u>Knowledge of</u>: Methods, procedures, and practices pertaining to Sonitrol/Video Monitoring Systems; Energy Management System Controls; incident document procedures.

<u>Ability to</u>: Maintain composure and be able to speak clearly under stressful situations; use Windows based computer programs to create a variety of spreadsheets and reports; report all incidents such as earthquake, fire, wind, and flood damage to the Director of Maintenance; understand and follow oral and written directions; establish and maintain cooperative working relationships.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

The physical requirements indicated below are examples of the physical aspects that this position classification must perform in carrying out essential job functions.

- will frequently exert 10 to 20 pounds of force to lift, carry, push, pull, or otherwise move objects
- will sit most of the time, but may walk or stand for brief periods of time; will occasionally be required to bend, stoop, crouch, kneel, reach above shoulder level, and/or to ascend and descend a step stool or step ladder
- must be capable of perceiving the nature of sound
- must possess visual acuity and depth perception
- must be capable or providing oral information, both in person and over the telephone and other communication devices
- must possess the manual dexterity to operate business-related equipment and to handle and work with various objects and materials

Reasonable accommodation may be made to enable a person with a disability to perform the essential functions of the job.

EXPERIENCE AND EDUCATION

Experience: Two years of experience in the incident and video monitoring field. Experience in Energy Management Systems is desirable.

Education: Verification of a High School diploma, a GED certificate, or a higher degree. Supplemental course work or training in security and EMS monitoring systems is desirable. A Sonitrol operator's certificate is desirable.

<u>License Requirement</u>: Possession of a valid California Motor Vehicle Operator's License.

<u>Condition of Employment</u>: Insurability by the District's liability insurance carrier may be required.
