

# HOURS AND FEES

- The Eisenhower Center is located in Abilene, Kansas, two miles south of the Abilene exit, off Interstate 70, on Kansas Highway 15 (also called Buckeye Avenue). All buildings at the Center are open every day, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. throughout the year, with the exception of Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Day. During the summer, beginning on Memorial Day, the Museum and Visitors Center are open until 5:45 p.m.
- A small fee is charged for admission to the exhibit areas of the Museum. Children under 16 are admitted free. No fee is charged at the other buildings.
- Handicapped facilities consist of chair lifts at the Home, Museum, and Library. Level entrances are provided at the Visitors Center and Place of Meditation. Wheelchair ramps also are located at the rear entrances to the Museum and Library buildings. Please advise sales desk personnel in the Visitors Center if there is a need to use these ramps.
- A gift fund is maintained by the Library, and private donations to this fund are used to provide services not covered by other funding. Such donations are tax exempt.
- EISENHOWER FOUNDATION - The foundation originated the Eisenhower Center when it acquired the family home in 1946. Since then the Foundation has been instrumental in the growth and programs of the Center. The Friends of the Foundation was organized in 1990 to better coordinate efforts, provide a membership base, and to further assist in educational programs and activities at the Center. - The research facilities of the Library are open Monday through Friday, excluding holidays, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. No fee is charged for admission to the research facilities, but advance written application must be made to the Director for research.
