Optional Assignments

Objective

Create an 8-page photo essay book on an historically significant place.

I have chosen two sites and you can create a photo essay book for each site, or you can choose to do a book on just one of the sites. Each site is worth 50 points.



Procedures

- Make plans to visit either the Lincoln Shrine in Redlands or the Richard Nixon Library and Birthplace Museum in Yorba Linda.
- Take a camera, a notebook and a couple of pens when you visit either or both of these sites. I recommend that you visit the web sites of these two places before you go and refer to them after you've made your visit. You can find them at the following sites:

- The Nixon Museum at www.nixonfoundation.org
- Gather information about each of the museums and be sure to take notes while you are there. Be sure to not only record the facts of your visit, but your thoughts and feelings about the place while you're there.
- Take plenty of photographs and be sure that you are in some of them!



Photo Essay Book

- Your book must be at least eight pages, not including cover and back, on standard-size paper.
- It must include an appealing cover, with a title and your name.
- It must include an introduction page which gives a quick summary of the place that you visited and it must be written *in your own words*!!
- It must include at least six (6) original photographs from the site you visited, including at least one with you in the picture.
- Each photograph must have a detailed caption that explains what is in the picture and what significance it has to the place you visited.
- Each page must have graphic elements (borders, graphics, etc.) that will enhance the look of the page.

The Lincoln Shrine is located in Redlands south of the Smiley Library. Traveling east on the 10 Freeway, if you pass the Orange exit you've gone too far!



The Nixon Library and Birthplace
